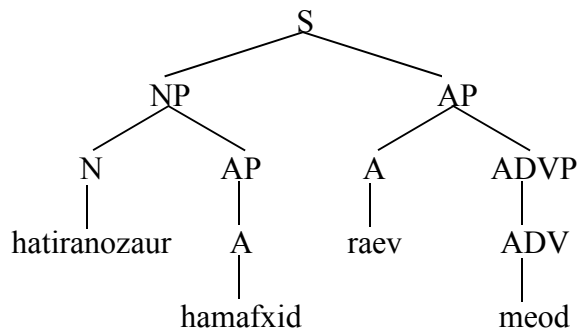


Hebrew Sentence Types, p. 1

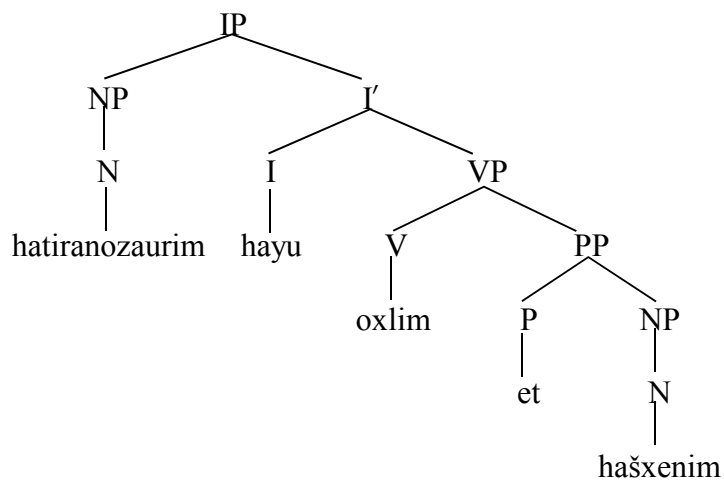
Nominal sentence

Ha- tiranozaur ha- mafxid raev meod.
 DEF- tyrannosaurus DEF- scary hungry very
 'The scary tyrannosaurus is very hungry.'



Verbal sentence with auxiliary

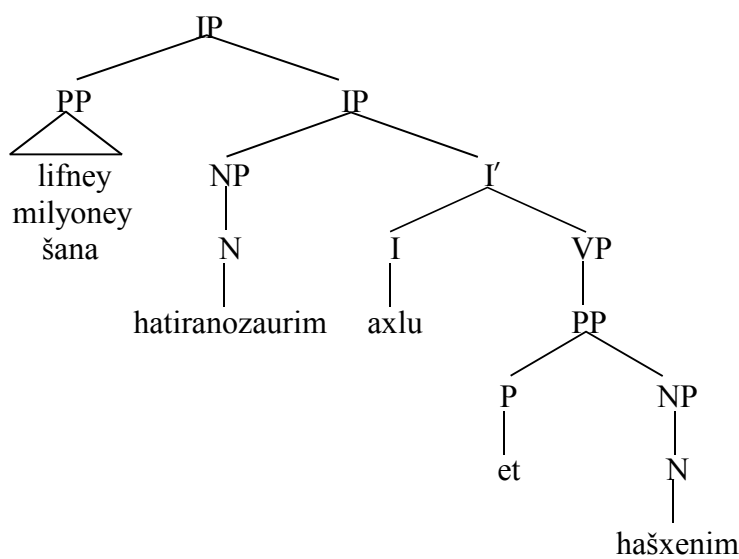
Ha- tiranozaurim hayu oxlim et ha- šxenim
 DEF- tyrannosauruses AUX eat.PART ACC DEF- neighbors
 'The tyrannosauruses used to eat the neighbors.'



Hebrew Sentence Types, p. 2

Verbal sentence with no auxiliary (with topicalized element)

Lifney milyoney šana, ha- tiranozaurim axlu et ha- šxenim
 before millions year DEF- tyrannosauruses ate ACC DEF- neighbors
 ‘Millions of years ago, the tyrannosauruses ate their neighbors.’



Verbal sentence with topicalized element and verb before subject (“Triggered Inversion”)

Lifney milyoney šana hayu ha- tiranozaurim oxlim et ha- šxenim.
 before millions year AUX DEF- tyrannosauruses eat ACC DEF- neighbors
 ‘Millions of years ago, the tyrannosauruses would eat their neighbors.’
